# A Safer Westchester Square Solutions we offer



Security is a key component to maintaining public safety at the Westchester Square BID and Garcia ("Anthony" as many merchants refer to him) spends his days communicating with the merchants and business, surveying the district, and reporting suspicious activities. His work in the district has allowed owners to have a greater sense of protection as they

conduct business and they have come to rely upon him during those times they needed assistance. "The most rewarding part of this job is being able to help the community and I am proud to represent the BID in this position". Anthony recently assisted an individual in need of services and contacted Bronx-Works. BronxWorks helps individuals and families improve their economic and social well-being. This is only one of the programs Anthony has partnered with to help the community.

The partnership between law enforcement and community stakeholders is essential to public safety and improves the health of business and residential communities. 

# **Business Bootcamp**


This year, we introduced an innovative approach to helping small business owners build upon and expand their customer base, market their businesses more effectively and improve their financial savvy through a three-part Business Bootcamp series. Merchants who attended this three-part series were pleased with the information and requested that we continue to offer these types of business-building workshops throughout the year to enhance their marketing and financial skills.

Each month from March through May, we invited all WSBID merchants to participate in a bootcamp on topics such as Marketing 101 in which basic guidance on how to implement an affordable marketing strategy was presented; Legal Foundations for Small Business, which touched upon the premise of understanding business agreements and other legal documents used by small business owners; and Financials 101, a session that provided information on the importance of financial literacy and stability in business.





